

## Pup-sicles Dog Sweater By Kathy Norris



Knifty Knitter round loom

- 12 to 15" chest = red round loom
- 16 to 18" chest = green round loom
- 19 to 21" chest = yellow round loom

Worsted weight yarn 1 skein

- If you are working with a round loom, you will use 2 strands of worsted weight so you may want to divide the skein into 2 balls

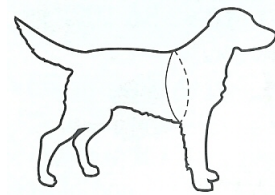
Fun Fur (optional)

Knifty Knitter tool

Crochet hook

Tapestry needle

- Note: To choose the size, measure your dog's chest (from back, around chest area that comes behind the front legs – this is the widest part of the chest). If measurement does not exactly match a specific size, choose the next larger. Also, measure dog from collar line to base of the tail so that you can adjust the length of the sweater for a better fit.
- Instructions given for different loom sizes will appear as follows:  
Red round loom (green round loom, yellow round loom)  
If one instruction appears, it is for all sizes.



Instructions:

- Using 2 strands of worsted weight (or 1 strand of worsted weight and 1 strand of fun fur), cast on all pegs of loom. As the cast on method doesn't matter, pick your favorite!
- Knitting in the round (circularly), flat stitch knit 10 rows.
- If you used the optional fun fur for the collar, cut it now leaving a tail to weave in later
- Add the 2<sup>nd</sup> strand of worsted weight so that you knit the body of the sweater with 2 strands of worsted weight yarn.
- Still knitting in the round, begin e-wrap knit stitch. E-wrap and knit for 4 (4 ½, 5 ½, 7) inches, or as needed for dog's chest (measure from center of neck to center of chest between front legs for this).

Make leg holes

- E-wrap peg 1 and knit off
- Move loop from peg 1 to peg 2
- E-wrap peg 2 and knit off 2 loops over 1 loop
- Move loop from peg 2 to peg 3
- E-wrap peg 3 and knit off 2 loops over 1 loop

- ❑ Move loop from peg 3 to peg 4
- ❑ E-wrap peg 4 and knit off 2 loops over 1 loop
- ❑ Move loop from peg 4 to peg 5
- ❑ E-wrap peg 5 and knit off 2 loops over 1 loop
- ❑ E-wrap and knit pegs 6 to 11 (6 to 13, 6 to 16)
- ❑ Move loop from peg 11 to 12 (13 to peg 14, 16 to 17)
- ❑ E-wrap peg 12 (14, 17) and knit off 2 loops over 1 loop
- ❑ Move loop from peg 12 to 13 (14 to 15, 17 to 18)
- ❑ E-wrap peg 13 (15, 18) and knit off 2 loops over 1 loop
- ❑ Move loop from peg 13 to 14 (15 to peg 16, 18 to 19)
- ❑ E-wrap peg 14 (16, 19) and knit off 2 loops over 1 loop
- ❑ Move loop from peg 14 to 15 (16 to peg 17, 19 to 20)
- ❑ E-wrap peg 14 (17, 20) and knit off 2 loops over 1 loop
- ❑ E-wrap and knit the rest of the pegs in this row as normal

Attach 2 new strands of worsted weight yarn to peg 5; working flat panel, e-wrap and knit pegs 5 to 10 (5 to 12, 5 to 15) for 4 rows. Cut this yarn, leaving tail to weave in later.

Using working yarn that is at peg 31 (36, 41), flat panel knit pegs 31 to 14 (36 to 17, 41 to 20).

E-wrap and knit pegs 14 to 31 (17 to 36, 20 to 41).

Repeat the last two instructions once more each.

Working yarn should be on the last peg of the loom.

Begin working circular knitting once again

- ❑ e-wrap first 4 empty pegs
- ❑ e-wrap and knit next pegs with stitches
- ❑ e-wrap next 4 empty peg
- ❑ e-wrap and knit the rest of the pegs in this row

Continue circular knitting, e-wrapping and knitting each peg until total length of sweater is 9" (11", 13") or the length desired.

Bind off stitches with crochet chain in between. Cut yarn leaving tail. Weave tails end.
